Birdathon is Houston Audubon's annual spring birding event where teams of birders and nature enthusiasts count as many bird species as possible in one month during Spring Migration season.

Birdathon for the Classroom is an opportunity for your students to discover a new passion and learn more about environmental conservation. Birds connect kids to the natural world and birding can get your students outside, encourage environmental stewardship, and deepen personal development.

How does it work?

Students can compete amongst each other to identify species or against other classes within your school (competition is not required).
