about 26 different birds, made amazing crafts throughout the year, learned 26 songs about the featured birds and had a great time exploring the grounds of the nature center. They all received a certificate, photo collage, CD of the songs and a song book. The BIRD Buddies and their families were also the first to enjoy the completed canopy deck in the forest. It got thumbs up from all and Trey Morris who completed the project received high fives from all the kids.



- Birds of a Feather Junior Ornithology Club from Smith Elementary spent a Saturday at SBUNC deepening their already great knowledge about birds and enjoying some great bird watching on site. We have been a partner with the clubs teacher for many years and look forward to working with more students from Smith in the future.
- The Gathering Place is a program of Interfaith Partners and provides an Alzheimer's Care Team at churches and synagogues around the city. Gathering Place meetings combine physical movement, socialization, music, and other memory-stimulating activity in a safe and comfortable 3.5-hour time block, enabling caregivers to attend to their personal

needs without worry. We have partnered with several churches over the years to make an annual visit during a Gathering Place meeting. It is always a special treat for both the volunteers and the loved ones with dementia to meet and learn about our native birds and their conservation. Dawn continues to nurture the Bird Tales program at several locations across Houston and Katy.




Red-winged Blackbirds and House Finches were the feature birds the last two months with interactive activities and songs about both.
